##### Subway:

4/5 to Bowling Green, walk west  
along Battery Place

W/R to Whitehall Street, walk  
west along Battery Place

1 to Rector Street. Walk south  
along Greenwich Street toward  
Battery Park, turn right onto  
Battery Place and walk west.

J/M/Z to Broad Street, walk one  
block west to Broadway, and  
then south to the corner of  
Battery Place at Bowling Green.  
Walk west on Battery Place

M1, 6, 15 to Battery Park  
M9, M20 to Battery Park City  
The Downtown Alliance operates  
a free shuttle bus that include a  
stop in front of the Museum.

##### Ferry:

Staten Island Ferry  
New York Water Taxi to Slip 6,

FDR Drive to Battery Park/Staten  
Island Ferry (Exit 1) or West Side  
Highway becomes West Street,  
turn right onto Battery Place. Call
